Access to the Connecticut Convention Center

The rolling street closures and openings for the 2019 Eversource Hartford Marathon will be in effect from 7:30 A.M. to 2:00 P.M. If you arrive or depart Hartford outside of these times, you will not be affected by the street closures.

Hampton Inn, 315 Pitkin Street – Turn right onto Pitkin as you exit the hotel. Go right on Jayce Street (following signs to 2 East), cross the East River Drive intersection (expect delays between 8:30-9:30am) and continue straight onto 2 East. Take Exit 5D onto Route 3 - Putnam Bridge, Exit onto Route 91 North to Exit 29A, then turn right onto Columbus Boulevard.

Holiday Inn Hartford Downtown Area, 100 East River Drive - Exit the hotel by making a right onto E. River Drive. Turn Left onto Route 6. This merges with Route 2 East. Take Exit 5D onto Route 3 - Putnam Bridge, Exit onto Route 91 North to Exit 29A, then turn right onto Columbus Boulevard.

To leave the Connecticut Convention Center: turn right out of the parking garage onto the 91N or 84W ramp located between the Marriott and Connecticut Science Center, directly outside the parking toll booth.

Please note: Columbus Boulevard and Exit 29A (off I-91 North and South) will remain open at all times on Saturday, October 12 with full access to the Connecticut Convention Center, Marriott Hartford Downtown and Connecticut Science Center. If traveling on foot, there are many options to reach the Connecticut Convention Center. Although closed to vehicular traffic, pedestrians may use many of the Downtown Hartford streets except during peak race times of 8:00 a.m. – 9:00 a.m. The streets being used by the Eversource Hartford Marathon with complete closure during this time include Asylum Avenue, Ford Street, Pearl Street, Central Row, American Row and Market Street. There is no access at American Row/Market Street from 8:05 a.m. to 8:20 a.m. to pedestrian or vehicular traffic.
